


CONSERVATION, RESTORATION OF CULTURAL PROPERTY AND SACRED ART

The Italian Cultural Institute developed a partnership with the Holy Spirit University of Kaslik (USEK), Faculty of Fine Arts, to facilitate contacts with the University of Urbino, in view of the creation of a three-year Diploma in "Conservation, Restoration of Cultural Property and Sacred Art", the first of its kind instituted in Lebanon. The University of Urbino,

founded in 1506 and with more than 15,000 students each year, is one of the oldest schools of Conservation and Restoration in Europe and participates in numerous projects on Cultural Heritage in the Mediterranean region. Considering the richness and the diversity of the Lebanese cultural and artistic heritage in general, and the religious cultural legacy in particular,

the Bachelor of Arts in Conservation, Restoration of Cultural Property and Sacred Art was created in order to meet the specific and urgent needs to preserve and restore the national heritage. The curriculum provides all the theoretical and practical knowledge related to the preservation, protection, and documentation of painted artworks on fabrics and wooden support.
